<b>1. Title: E Safety DVD</b>

<b>3. What was the issue? Following the tragic rape and murder of a Darlington student, Ashleigh Hall, by a man she met through a social networking site, her peers decided to produce an E Safety DVD to be used in schools and community settings, to raise awareness about E Safety. <b>5. What impact has this had (so far)?</b> <b>The DVD has been shown to various students in many different settings and is raising awareness about the dangers of communicating with strangers on the internet. This could even save lives.</b>
